

Viable Intersection Alternative


The <u>recommended intersection design concept</u> is a combination of components from multiple intersection alternatives that were examined during the alternative examination process.

The recommended intersection design concept includes:

- Restricted Crossing U-Turn Intersection at the Porchers Bluff Road and Highway 17 intersection.
- Modified Diverging Diamond Intersection at the Highway 41 and Highway 17 intersection
- Overpass Bridge for Highway 17 North at the intersection of Highway 17/Winnowing Way/Porchers Bluff Road
- Extension/widening of Winnowing Way to Highway 41
- Roundabouts at Hamlin Road and Brickyard Parkway

delays to neighborhoods.






What We Know: Roundabout Facts

- Based on traffic projections, the Brickyard Parkway and Hamlin Road roundabouts will
 only see <u>small number of vehicles</u> using the roundabouts for u-turns
- Large vehicles (i.e. firetrucks, buses, boat trailers) will be able to <u>safely and easily</u>
 <u>navigate</u> through the proposed roundabouts
- The proposed roundabouts will have <u>no direct impacts</u> on Brickyard's community amenities
- Along Brickyard Parkway, the <u>current speed limit of 25 mph</u> will remain the same.
- The roundabouts would act as a <u>traffic calming device</u> and would require vehicles to <u>reduce their speed</u> while approaching and navigating the roundabout.
- Additional left and right turn lanes will be added to Brickyard Parkway and Hamlin Road to further enhance traffic flow.




Features of the design concept – Brickyard Parkway at Hamlin Road



No total property impacts to homes or businesses in this area



Emergency services
would be able to make
lefts from
Highway 17 into
neighborhood areas



No impacts to the existing community center and amenities



Speed limit would remain 25 mph on Brickyard Parkway and speeds would reduce as traffic approaches the roundabout

What If Scenarios: Future Traffic Realities


What if no intersection improvements are made at the Brickyard Parkway & Hamlin Road intersection?

- The Brickyard Parkway and Hamlin Road intersection will NOT be able to accommodate future projected traffic volumes
- There will be traffic gridlock and backups surrounding this intersection
- It will become nearly impossible to turn left into Brickyard Plantation
 - At peak traffic times, the left hand turning lane into Brickyard Plantation is estimated to have over 60 cars waiting to turn left (1/4 mile of waiting cars)
- It will be very unsafe and therefore prohibited to turn left into Brickyard Plantation
 without the signalized green light, because a vehicle will be attempting to cross freeway
 level traffic






Highway 41 and Highway 17 Intersection
